The CARE Project has a number of components designed to bring families and professionals together for




sharing and processing emotions, with the ultimate goal being acceptance and advocating for the best life possible.

CARE is a multidimensional tool that addresses the grief associated with hearing loss for individuals, families, communities, professionals and pre-professionals.



When a child is born with a hearing loss the entire family is affected. Most times this is surprise and the family is left to adjust.

Emotional processing and learning a way to communicate with the new family member are two of the first challenges.
